The NGO was established by the initiative of a group of philanthropic and dedicated men and women of Satkhira area. Peace Foundation is run by a seven members Executive Committee (EC). It has a properly constituted managing body with clearly defined rules and responsibilities for office bearers. It is registered with Social Welfare. The founders included a group of highly educated social workers from the same locality committed to offering health care services, education and other human welfare services in the community.

13. Management Structure:

Peace Foundation is operated as per approved constitution of the organization. It has three types of structure:

a) General Body

The total number of members of the General Body is 21. At least one general meeting is held annually. General Body approves the activities of the Executive Committee.

b) Executive Committee

The Executive Director plays the role of General Secretary to the Executive Committee as per the constitution. But the Executive Director has no right for casting vote in taking any decision in the meeting of the Executive Committee. The duration of the Executive Committee is 3 years. The Social Services, Govt. of the Peoples Republic of Bangladesh approves the Executive Committee.

14. Development Approach and Strategy:

The main strategy of Peace Foundation in implementing its present activities is to assist beneficiaries as the development partners or facilitators. Some working strategies of Peace Foundation are mentioned below:

Group Approach

Peace Foundation strongly believes that sustainability of the organization depends on the sustainability of the beneficiary target groups. Peace Foundation implements most of its programs/projects by organizing beneficiaries in groups. Groups decide what kind of approach and assistance they need. Peace Foundation assists them in taking proper decision. In the light of the decision taken by the groups, Peace Foundation provides the group members with technical and financial supports.

Bottom-up Approach

Peace Foundation follows a bottom-up and participatory development approach as its working strategy. With this end in view, Peace Foundation first starts mobilizing and organizing beneficiaries through awareness building.

Family Approach

Though the women are organized as the primary beneficiaries, all members of beneficiary family have to participate in development activities. In the decision making process of the development issues of a family, Peace Foundation ensures the participation of every adult member of the family. Peace Foundation tries to increase the skills of every family member so that they can implement an enterprise jointly for the betterment of the family.


Cluster Approach/Community Approach

C. Program/Projects and other Activities

Programs and Area of Activities

As an NGO, Peace Foundation is implementing various development programs and projects; most of those are with the financial assistance of its development partners/agencies and private sector, while some is exclusively from its own resources. Bangladesh being a poverty stricken country, poverty reduction is the major working area of Peace Foundation However; it also works in other fields of human development.

1. Education:

Peace Foundation has been implementing different education program since 2008 with a view to ensuring literacy, basic education and livelihood skills to the disadvantaged illiterate people. So far, Peace Foundation has imparted basic education to 770 persons of whom 450 are children and the rest 320 are adults.

2. Health, Sanitation and Nutrition:

Among the five basic needs of human being, health is considered as important one. In Bangladesh the rural and urban poor people has very limited access to health services. As such, Peace Foundation is committed to provide health and sanitation services to all of its beneficiaries and the community people in its program areas.

Major intervention of health, nutrition and sanitation program is to increase awareness on health, nutrition, sanitation, hygiene and Prevention of HIV/AIDS of the household members.

3. Agriculture Extension Program

Peace Foundation since its beginning has been operating on agriculture extension program. The agriculture program of Peace Foundation sets the goal to increase income and employment of the target people through increasing forestry, fishery, livestock and poultry. Special attention has been given to the marginal and small farmers; especially the women and they are largely supported to be involved in agro based income generating activities for molding their livelihood towards self-reliance.

4. Drug Addict Prevention:

We are also working on prevention of drug among young people in Satkhira district. We are working on these issues with community based organization (CBO). Peace Foundation is also working on Anti Smoking Campaign etc.

5. STD/HIV/AIDS Prevention:

HIV/AIDS today has become one of the deadly diseases ever faced by mankind. Although prevalence rates are still low in Bangladesh, HIV/AIDS is an emerging public health risk that has the potential of significant negative impact on a broad range of socio-economic development indicators unless steps are taken to control its spread. Recognizing the importance of the issue, Peace Foundation has been intervening in the field since 2012.

Through the advocacy and sensitization of religious leaders, community leaders and policy makers, a general awareness has been created to prevent HIV/AIDS among youths, adolescents and IDUs.

6. Advocacy and Governance:

Of late, Peace Foundation is involved in different program on advocacy, aiming to protect the rights of women and children of the areas. Major objectives of the program are to: (a) ensure proper and effective application of laws that protect the rights of the women and children through stimulating beneficiary's involvement and (b) aware the stakeholders about the non-discriminatory application of laws that protect the rights of women and children of the program areas.

7. Gender:

Peace Foundation attaches high priority to gender equity and strives to bring about positive and lasting changes in the lives of Bangladeshi women and girls through empowering them to take control of their own lives.

Peace Foundation also provides gender orientation to its beneficiaries (men, women and children including staff members). Peace Foundation actively participates in various forums and campaigns aiming at reducing gender discrimination and violence against women. It also is engaged in advocacy for eliminating gender discriminatory laws, policies and practices.

8. Human Rights & Good Governance:

We are working to ensure human rights at community level. Now we are raising awareness on various human rights issues through group meeting at grassroots level.

9. Rehabilitation of the Persons with Disability:

Peace Foundation has implemented a Disability Rights, Own Fund at Satkhira Sadar upazilla of Satkhira district in Bangladesh. Primary beneficiaries of the action include 20 disabled women of the implementation areas.

10. Climate Change and Environment Promotion:

Climate change in the global context can be attributed to the excessive emission of green house gases into atmosphere that results mostly from the burning of fossil fuel. The resultant build-up of gases in turn causes various kinds of natural disasters in the form of flood, cyclone, salinity, drought, etc. Bangladesh, because of its geographical position, is very prone to these natural hazards. PF worked with local Govt. to the vulnerable girls & women aimed to access socio economic sectors giving social female leaders.

11. Cultural activities & Awareness Raising:

Cultural activities are an important/strong way to raise awareness among community people. Peace Foundation also organize street drama, drama to emphasize local popular theme on different burning issues like, Drug, Family Planning,

12. Trafficking:

Trafficking of children and women is a major problem in Bangladesh. Responding to the problem, Peace Foundation launched a project named "Trafficking prevention campaign" in own fund 2011. Main objective of the project is to implement a comprehensive trafficking prevention campaign by organizing workshops at district and upazila levels, capacity building training, teachers/parents forum meetings, meetings with media, etc. As a result, trafficking of children and women reduced significantly in the project area.

13. Monitoring:

Peace Foundation has an intensive monitoring system. Peace Foundation field organizers intensively supervise the group activities and regular collection of savings and credit installments. Weekly monitoring form duly filled by the field organizer is submitted to the supervisor / branch in-charge. Monthly activities and financial reports are submitted and reviewed in the monthly branch meeting. Branch has to submit its monthly report to the head office. Quarterly, half yearly and annul reports (of both activities and financial) are prepared and submitted to the head office. Head office personnel regularly visit every branch to supervise and monitor the branch activities. Head office audit team audits the accounts in all level. Besides this all accounts are audited annually by a NGO Bureau enlisted registered auditor. Governing Body of Peace Foundation meets regularly to look after the overall activities of Peace Foundation. Head office monitoring system is computerized.

2. Future Plan:

Peace Foundation in the future would increasingly emphasize the sustainable through transferring ownership of the organization to the beneficiaries.
